Eighty voters marched to the annual village election here in Wilmont Tuesday and cast their vote for the man of their choice. Following is the way they voted: Councilman: Francis Foley - 34, P. J. Heinrichs - 23; Treasurer: Bernard Stuntebeck - 62 votes; Clerk: LeRoy Hindt - 30, P. J. Wagner - 28; Assessor: J. J. Broich - 33, J. N., Scholtes - 18, Matt Michels - 7; Andy Pacholl received 30 votes for Justice of Peace and Alphonse Arens 16 votes for Constable.

Funeral services were conducted for John Wesley Smith on Tuesday afternoon, December 3, at one o'clock at Hanson Funeral home in Worthington and at 2 o'clock at the Presbyterian Church with the Rev. E. W. Corbit in charge. Burial was made in the Adrian Cemetery. Mr. Smith passed away early Saturday after a brief illness due to advance age. He was 91 at the time of death.

Mr. Smith has been a resident of Wilmont vicinity since 1916 and of Nobles County for the past 46 years. Mr. Smith was born in Plainfield, Iowa on September 11, 1855. On September 13, 1873, he was married to Marie Thompson at Waverly, Iowa. They lived at Plainfield until 1900 when they moved to the Adrian vicinity. In 1910 they moved to the Wilmont vicinity where the family has since farmed. Survivors include: six of his 12 children, Ned Smith, Bakersfield, Cal.; Harry Smith, Rochester, Alva Smith, Richland, Wash.; and Mrs. Otto Joens, Claude and Grace Smith of Wilmont. Two daughters and four sons preceded him in death, the latest in 1943 and 1944. Mrs. Smith died in 1930. Other survivors are 13 grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren.

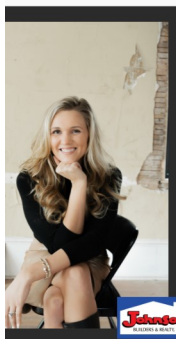

Tenaska Nobles 2 Wind Farm Awards \$7,500 in College Scholarships  
Three Nobles County High School Seniors Receive Education Funds

Nobles 2 Power Partners, LLC, owner of the Nobles 2 Wind Project (Nobles 2) in Wilmont, has awarded a total of \$7,500 in scholarships to three graduating seniors in Nobles County. Each student received a \$2,500 scholarship as a part of the Tenaska Scholarship Program.

The Tenaska Scholarship Program aims to recognize hardworking students in the local community and help reduce the financial burden of pursuing higher education. This is the fifth year Nobles 2 is awarding deserving students scholarship support. The money can be used toward two- or four-year post-secondary education programs at accredited institutions.

"Nobles 2 is proud to be part of this community, and supporting local students is one of the most concrete ways we can show that," said Grant Ahern, Asset Manager at Tenaska. "Congratulations to this year's recipients."

Tenaska, headquartered in Omaha, Nebraska, is one of the leading independent power producers in the United States and manages scholarship programs in communities where its generating facilities are located. To date, more than \$1 million in scholarships have been given out to more than 1,200 students across the country. The Nobles 2 Scholarship Program began in the 2021-2022 school year and has awarded \$33,000 in scholarships to 15 students to date.

The Nobles 2 wind farm is supported by an operations team of 14 local employees staffed through NAES Corporation and Vestas. The facility produces 250 megawatts of renewable energy that is sold to Minnesota Power. Since its inception in 2020, the wind farm has paid \$5.1 million in local property taxes.

His enthusiasm extended beyond the ballpark; he was an avid collector of baseball cards and Twins memorabilia, and he cherished all Minnesota sports teams. But his greatest joy came from time spent with loved ones.
