YEARS AGO—written by Audrey Brake— Thanks Audrey for all these memories!

Taken from the Feb. 6, 13, & 20, 1947 Wilmont Tribune

Wilmont

Pvt. Billie Sievers arrived at Worthington Thursday from Camp Lee, Virginia for a ten-day furlough with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. J. Sievers. Billy will leave on Sunday for Camp Stone, California.

On January 21st, the regular meeting was called to order by President. of Council, N. D. Bertrand. Members present - N. D. Bertrand, Joe Probst, Frank Foley, Art Wulf, and LeRoy Hindt. The minutes were read and approved. Three representatives from Interstate Power Co. discussed having 4 more street lights installed, along with new poles. It was also brought up to have the cafes close one hour earlier on Saturday nights and stay open one hour longer on Sunday nights. A motion was also made to raise Alphonse Arens salary by \$20 a month, making his total wage \$160 per month.

The Art. B. Thomas Shows have been booked for two big 'gala days' in Wilmont on Tuesday and Wednesday, July 1 and 2nd. The Thomas Show has rides and concessions galore. They are appearing at the Legion Convention at Sioux Falls on June 8, 9, 10, & 11 and at 14 county fairs in Nebraska, Iowa, and Minnesota.

Individuals having \$500 or more income in 1946 are required by law to file a return by March 15, 1947. To assist taxpayers in filing their returns, a Deputy Collector will be in Wilmont on February 25th from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m..

A total of \$543.37 was collected during the Infantile Paralysis Drive here and \$4 expenses were taken from this amount, which leaves a net sum of \$539.37. These are the figures handed here by J. J. Broich, local chairman of the drive.

A total of \$370.30 was collected in the Nobles County Rural Schools for the Infantile Paralysis Fund, which was \$94 more than was given in 1945.

Due to the blizzard and mail conditions, the film for "The State Fair" did not arrive here until Monday. Therefore, no show was held Sunday. During the past weeks when we've had so much snow and blizzard weather, our new "Kee" Theatre showed to good crowds all evenings.

We again wish to plead with parents to warn their teenagers and younger boys and girls not to hitch their sled on the back of cars. Since the roads have been icy and fine for sled runners, almost nightly, one may see as many as three sleds abreast fastened to moving cars and though, we in this village, have been fortunate not to have accidents caused, it is too late to save that victim by caution, and the lesson is costly. These adolescents are sure they can let loose at will and nothing can happen to them. It is always the unforeseen or unprepared for that causes disaster. You deal not only with your own self and sled, but with the driver of the car you follow, road conditions and the car driver who meets or passes that car and who may not be alert or quick enough to see the towed sleds or calculate clearance. Please warn you young folk to play safe and take no unnecessary risks.

With school starting, the photos this week are of the two original schools that were built in Wilmont. The first photo is of the original Catholic school which was built in 1915. Before this school, classes were held in a home owned by Mrs. Clem Schlichte. The school, built in 1915, burned down in February, 1925 and was soon replaced by another school which started being used in November of that same year. The second photo is of the original public school which is how it looked from 1901 -1913. An addition was then added onto this building which doubled its size.

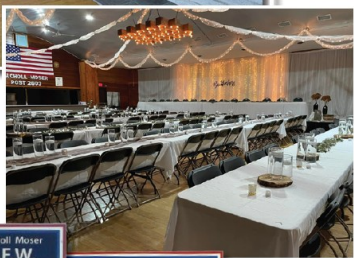

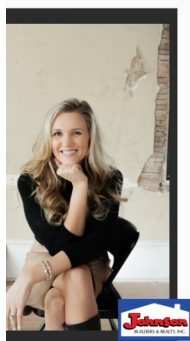
